

Welcome to the Park

Alice Lake Provincial Park, named for Alice Rose who was the first woman settler to hike and fish in this area, is surrounded by towering mountains, dense forests and grassy areas. Four fresh water lakes dominate the landscape offering plenty of excellent family fun and adventure activities.

Things to Do



There are 2 sandy beach areas with floating docks and change houses. Swimming areas are marked by buoys.



Adventure playground has a slide, tire swing and other equipment. Horseshoe pits available in campground.



Four Lakes trail is 8 km and takes a circuitous route past all four lakes. Biking permitted Sept 15 to May 1.



DeBeck's Hill trail is 3 km (return) providing views of the Tantalus Range and Mt. Garibaldi. Fairly strenuous. **Bob MacIntosh Memorial, Mike's Loop, Jacks Trail, Tracks from Hell** also provide hiking and biking trails.



Stump Lake Loop offers easy, scenic walking.

Alice Lake Loop provides an easy hike for families and is wheelchair accessible.



Swamp Lantern Loop offers interpretation signage along with an easy family-oriented hike.



Canoeing and kayaking are popular lake activities.



Fishing, shellfish harvesting or removal of other marine life is permitted with an appropriate license.



Visitor Services



Shower buildings provide hot water and electrical outlets. There is no extra fee for these facilities.



Visitors can use sani-station for a fee of \$2.00 per use.



55 campsites and one group camping site have electrical hook-ups. The extra charge is \$6/night.



Roads, campsites 17/18, some picnic tables and the Alice Lake trail are wheelchair accessible.

Enjoy Your Stay

Park regulations protect the natural state of the park and ensure a quality experience for all visitors.

- Fires are permitted in designated fire rings only. Visitors may bring firewood or purchase at park.
- Pets must be on a leash at all times. Please be responsible for their behaviour and waste.
- Anything with an odour could attract wildlife to your site. Place garbage in bins, avoid cooking inside tents and tent trailers, and store all food supplies, including coolers, in your vehicle.
